

Enlarge these sentences, then cut them up and put them into an envelope with the number on the outside. Let Ss work in small groups to make the sentences. Have them copy them in their notebooks with the number from the envelope. Don't help them. When everyone is finished have Ss write the sentences on the board. Correct them as a class and have Ss correct the sentences in their notebooks. To extend this activity you can change the number of the sentences, then once they are corrected and on the board have Ss decide what order to put them in to tell the story, or you can have the sentences ready to hand out in strips and give them to groups to sequence. Then if you have been working with questions, have Ss in pairs or small groups write 2-3 questions about the story and join with another pair to ask and answer. They can do this orally or in writing or both.
