

Wall Dictation:

Directions: Cut out a dictation, one for each pair of students in your class. Put your students in cross language pairs. Put the dictations on the wall near each pair of students, but far enough away so that they can not see the words from where they are sitting. One student will be the "teacher" and read the paragraph to the other student who will write it. The "teacher" can get up as many times as necessary and read again to the student. The student may ask clarification questions. When the pair is done, the student may check his/her work with the printed dictation.
