Sentence combining

Sometimes we want to add two sentences together when we write. One way to do that is to use a comma with and, or, but, so.

Examples:

- 1. The students speak in English, and they study grammar.
- 2. Jean drinks tea, but she doesn't drink coffee.
- 3. You can do your homework now, or you can do it in the morning before class.
- 4. The students want to improve their writing, so they signed up for an intensive writing class.
