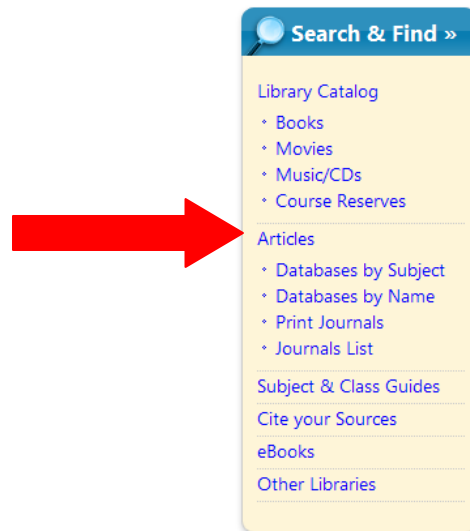

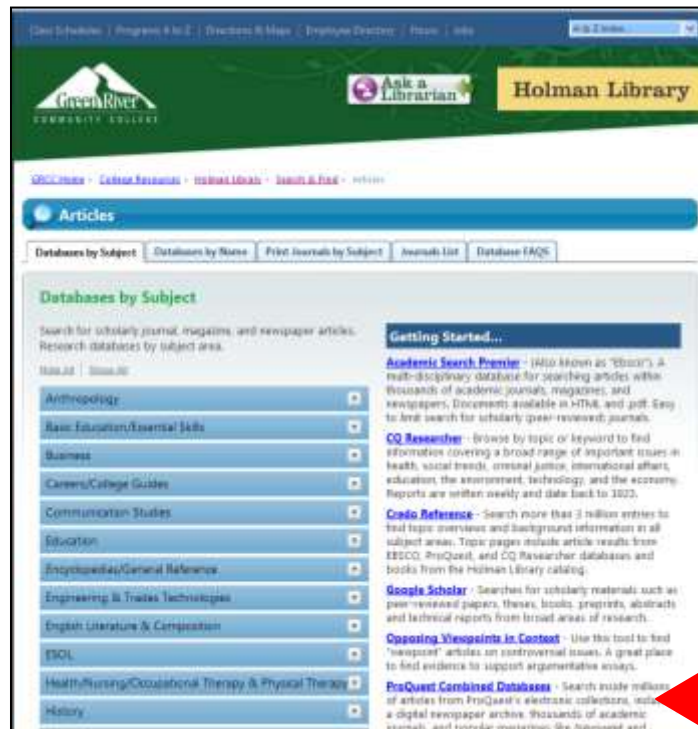

- c. In the Getting Started section, click **ProQuest Combined Databases**:




- d. Fill in the search boxes with your keywords from #2 above. Use a separate search box for each keyword:
