Six Steps to Test Analysis

The Six Steps to Test Analysis are from the *Math Study Skills Workbook* by Paul D. Nolting, Ph. D.

1. Misread directions

Misread directions occur when a student skips the directions or misunderstands the directions.

2. Careless Errors

Careless errors are the type that a student would catch if he/she read over the problem.

3. Concept Errors

Concept errors are cognitive mistakes made when the student does not understand the properties or principles required to work the problem.

4. Application Errors

Application errors occur when a student knows the concept but cannot apply it to the problem.

5. Test Taking Errors

Test taking errors apply to the way the student takes the test. Some test taking errors are not following the Ten Steps to Better Test Taking, working a problem to long, not showing your work, or not completing the second step of a two step problem.

6. Study Errors

Study errors occur when a student studies the wrong type of material, puts less focus on important material, or crams for the test.
